This Award is conducted by the Agricultural Societies Council of SA who will be duly responsible for selecting the State winner during the course of the Royal Adelaide Show. The Awards will be run by qualifications through country shows to association finals with a State final being held at the Royal Adelaide Show. **Full details and entry forms available from the Secretary.** Entries close on 1st October 2019.

Aims:

- To highlight the importance of youth in rural South Australia and in particular the agricultural show movement.
- To identify and encourage enthusiastic, skilful, industrious and unselfish young people.
- To give young people a forum to express their views through education and experience and develop closer links with the agricultural industries.

Entry Requirements:

- **Rural Ambassador** applicants must be **aged between 20 years and 30 years** inclusive at the time of their local show.
- **Young Rural Ambassador** applicants must be **aged between 16 years and 19 years** inclusive at the time of their local show.
- Provide information indicating their reasons for applying together with details of work experience, community participation and agricultural show involvement.
- To represent Callington, must reside within 50kms of the Callington Post Office.
- Be enthusiastic and knowledgeable about rural life and affairs and agricultural shows.
- Be able to spend the required time at the Local Show, Group Level finals and the State Final at the Royal Adelaide Show.

SOUTHERN COUNTRY SHOWS ASSOCIATION RULES

No entry will be received from any person disqualified by any Society in this Association, or by the Southern Country Shows Association, during the period of such disqualification. Should an entry be accepted it shall, when discovered, be deemed void and the entry fee may be forfeited.

GENERAL

2. Membership of the Callington A&H Society will be \$20. This entitles members to vote at all meetings, and to receive tickets for two adults and two children and a Show Book for this year's show. Membership fees must be paid at least 7 days prior to the Show.
3. All persons must wear the wristband provided, when entering the Show.
4. The Committee reserves the right to postpone the date of the Show or to close the Show should it be advisable to do so, without incurring any liability by so postponing or abandoning.
5. Unless by prior arrangement, the Callington Show will take no responsibility for goods/exhibits not collected by 5.00pm on the day of the Show.
6. All rulings of the Committee shall be final.
7. **SPECIAL NOTE / DISCLAIMER:** While every care has been exercised in the compilation of this Show Book, the committee will not hold itself responsible for any errors or omissions therein, and reserves the right to amend the order of running of events should such be deemed necessary.
8. The show has a **NO DOG** policy. Service Dogs exempt.

TRADE SPACE & STALL HOLDERS

9. Persons are invited to add to the attraction of the Show by exhibiting anything rare or of choice without admission fee subject to the approval by the Committee.
10. **Trade Space** exhibitors can obtain space by application to the Secretary. Applications can be downloaded from the Show website. Two Free Entry Passes will be supplied per stall if payment of fee is received at least two weeks prior to the Show. Stallholders paying after this date will be required to pay for full admission.

14. Entries in all classes must be made on the forms provided by the Show, and addressed to the Secretary, to be received no later than the date specified. **A SEPARATE FORM MUST BE USED FOR EACH SECTION.** Exhibitors are encouraged to enter early. **No Late Entries Accepted - No Phone Entries.** The Convenor will not be responsible for any inaccuracies which may occur if the foregoing provisions are not complied with.
15. All Fees must accompany Entry Forms by the specified date. **Note** some sections require exhibit to be delivered with entry fees.

16. All entries are accepted subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Show.
17. **Junior Exhibitors** must be aged 16 or under as of 1st November 2019.
18. Entry Forms are provided in the centre of the Show book. Additional Entry Forms can be supplied on request to the Secretary, photocopied from the Show book or obtained from the website.
19. All Hall Exhibits must be staged on Saturday 27th October 2019 by **NO LATER THAN 12.00noon** sharp for judging unless otherwise stated.
20. All exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor. Exhibits that have previously won FIRST PRIZE at the Callington Show are ineligible to compete.
21. No exhibitor's name to appear on any exhibit until after the prizes have been awarded.
22. All exhibitors and general public **MUST** leave the Hall while judging is in progress. Convenors, officials and stewards excepted.
23. No exhibitor or his agent, including stewards, will have any personal communications with the judges while they are completing their duties. On it being proven that such communication has occurred, the exhibitor shall be disqualified.
24. Any person proven, to the satisfaction of the Committee, guilty of any fraudulent or discreditable conduct in connection with any entry form or exhibit, or of using any abusive or unseemly remarks to a Judge or Official may, in addition to forfeiting all prize-money awarded at the Show at which such conduct may occur, be declared incapable of competing for or winning any prizes at any Show held by this Committee for such period as the Committee may decide.
25. No prize will be awarded unless an exhibit is deemed worthy by the judges, who may award second and third prizes in lieu of first and second.
26. The judge's decision is final.
27. The Convenor has the right to add extra classes, if enough entries require such action.

Pour $\frac{1}{4}$ cup batter into centre prepared tin.

Pour $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chocolate batter into centre

of plain batter. Repeat with remaining batters.

Cook in moderate oven (180°C) for 45 minutes or until brown.

Stand in pan 10 minutes then turn onto board to cool. ICE TOP ONLY WHEN COOL

German Stollen

125g blanched almonds	1 teaspoon sugar
125 g mixed peel	$\frac{1}{2}$ cup lukewarm water
375 g raisins	5 cups plain flour
$\frac{1}{4}$ cup rum	250 g butter
60 g compressed yeast	$\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar, extra
1 cup lukewarm milk	pinch salt

Chop almonds, mixed peel & raisins finely; place in bowl; pour over rum; stand 1 hour.

In another bowl cream yeast & sugar, add lukewarm water, stir well. Stand in warm place until frothy (approx 15 minutes).

Sift flour & salt; Rub in butter; Add extra sugar & fruit mixture; Mix well. Combine lukewarm milk & yeast mixture; Add to flour; Mix well; Cover & stand in warm place 35 – 40 minutes.

Pizza Scrolls

300g (2 cups) self-raising flour
Pinch of salt
90g butter, cut into cubes
160ml (2/3 cup) milk
Plain flour, to dust
60g (1/4 cup) pizza sauce
80g (1 cup) coarsely grated cheddar
150g Primo English Ham, coarsely chopped
1 x 225g can pineapple pieces, drained on paper towel
Extra milk, to brush

Preheat oven to 210°C. Line a baking tray with non-stick baking paper. Sift the flour & salt into a large bowl. Use your fingertips to rub the butter into the flour until it resembles fine breadcrumbs. Add the milk. Use a round-bladed knife in a cutting motion to mix until evenly incorporated & the mixture begins to hold together.

Turn the dough onto a lightly floured surface & gently knead until smooth. Use a lightly floured rolling pin to roll out the dough into a 30 x 40cm rectangle.

Spread the pizza sauce evenly over the dough, leaving a 2cm border around the edge. Sprinkle with the cheddar, ham & pineapple. Starting from a long side, roll up firmly to form a log. Brush the edge with a little extra milk & press down firmly to seal the log. Cut crossways into 12 equal portions, about 3cm thick. Place scrolls on the prepared tray. Bake in preheated oven for 25-30 minutes or until golden brown. Remove from oven & set aside to cool.

Scottish Black Bun

500 g raisins	½ cup sugar
500 g currants	2 tsp cinnamon
90 g blanched almonds	1 tsp cream of tartar
60 g mixed peel	½ tsp bicarb soda
2 cups plain flour	½ cup brandy
¼ tsp ground allspice	1 cup milk
2 tsp ground ginger	

Chop almonds & mixed peel.

Sift all dry ingredients into bowl; Mix in fruit & almonds. Add brandy & milk; mix to soft consistency; Set aside while making pastry.

Pastry

3 cups plain flour	125 g butter
Pinch salt	½ cup water (approx)
¼ tsp baking powder	1 egg

Sift flour, salt & baking powder into bowl; rub in butter until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs. Mix to firm dough with water. Roll out pastry to fit greased loaf tin (23cm x 12cm approx); Line tin with pastry; fill with fruit mixture to within 1cm of top of pastry. Smooth top of fruit mixture.

Roll out remaining pastry to fit top of bun. Glaze edges of pastry with beaten egg, cover with pastry top, pinch edges together. Using sharp knife, create steam vents. Glaze top. Bake 2½ to 3 hours; Cool in tin on wire rack; turn out when cold.

Pizza Sauce (for scrolls)

1 can whole peeled tomatoes, in juice
1 clove garlic, peeled and minced
1 teaspoon dried oregano
Pinch fresh ground black pepper

1 small white onion finely diced and minced
3 to 4 fresh basil leaves
Pinch salt
Pinch sugar, optional

Empty the contents of the tomato can in a mixing bowl and coarsely crush the tomatoes with a fork leaving them just a little chunky. Sauté onions in olive oil, over medium heat, until slightly translucent. Add the garlic and sauté about a minute until golden. Add crushed tomatoes to the mix. Stir well and bring to a simmer. Season with salt and pepper, to taste; then add the fresh basil and oregano. Add a touch of sugar if desired or if tomatoes are tart. Simmer on a low flame, stirring often for at least 15 minutes. Sauce can be stored in refrigerator for a week in airtight container.
